## **Project in focus**

#### A Balancing Act between Swift and Slow Planning

When society faces forest fires or the need to find accommodation for refugees, finding the balance between fast and expert-driven action and taking the time to ground decisions through citizen dialogue can be tricky. The Swift and Slow project started investigating these tensions in 2020 and is nearing its end. To round things off, the research team organised workshops throughout the year, inviting city planners and dialogue facilitators to explore the dialogue system they are part of. This means mapping where decisions are taken, who has access to these activities, and whether the actions of different actors complement or mitigate one another.

This autumn, the team has explored citizen involvement in decisions in Uppsala, the way

towards a sustainable energy transition in Karlstad and the planning of elderly care in Åre. In addition to forming the basis of an upcoming research article, the idea is also that participants at these workshops use the system maps to pinpoint opportunities for communication and decision-making between public officials and citizens.
